I would like to thank the Grafton Leo and Lions who helped the Salvation Army Bell Ringing at Pick n Save in Grafton on Friday and Saturdays from November 17th- December 23rd from 4 - 8 PM.

The amount collected from Grafton Pick N Save Bell Ringing was up considerably from last year.

- Last year we got \$3,123.24 from Bell Ringing
- This year we got \$7,024.25
- In 2021, we did \$6,342.78 and 2020, we did \$8,836.73
- In 2020 and in 2021, Ozaukee Congregational helped form noon- 4 PM which increased the total.
- County wide, the total will be over \$50,000 up over \$10,000 from last year.

Once again thank you for your service. We gave 110 service hours and had 49 volunteers between Leos and Lions.

A special thank you to Leo President Trevor for getting so many Leos to fill the spots on the schedule and thank you Lion Tim Kohlwey, Mike Hennig, Marko Musich, and Cari Buri for filling times that the Leos were unable to be filled.
